




# Define your purpose

This module with help you...

• Describe the importance of a clear purpose



• Define the purpose and intended impact of your speech

"Perfection in design is achieved not when there is nothing left to add, but when there is nothing left to take away."

### Purpose: what impact do you intend?

- General purpose can be to:
  - Inform: "I want people to know how to..."
  - Persuade: "I want people to see the benefits of..."
  - Entertain: "I want people to enjoy..."
  - Inspire: "I want people to go out and..."
- Specific purpose ("premise") fills in the "..." in ONE sentence
- What is *your* unique perspective?

#### Activity: Draft your speech purpose

Purpose	On your Module 1 worksheet, write a first draft of your speech purpose from your own perspective in question 1.1
Process	<ul> <li>In question 1.1, write your:</li> <li>1. General purpose (inform, persuade, entertain or inspire)</li> <li>2. Specific purpose (what you are going to talk about)</li> <li>3. The unique perspective do you bring in the speech</li> </ul>
Product	Each participant will have the first draft of their speech purpose statement
Post-activity debrief	None—we'll refine the purpose after the next section

## Audience: who will you impact?

- Define the audience
- Sit in their seats and ask WIIFM? ("What's in it for me?")
- Re-express your purpose from *their* perspective



### Outcome: changing hearts and minds

- What change do you want to invoke *in the audience*?
- What do you want them to do (differently)?
- How do you want to make them feel?

...revisit your purpose based on audience and outcome

#### Activity: (Re)define your speech purpose

Purpose	On your Module 1 worksheet, describe you audience, the outcome you hope to have, which may change how you express your purpose.
Process	<ul> <li>In questions 1.2 to 1.4,</li> <li>1. Review your audience and intended outcome,</li> <li>2. Write your purpose to reflect these,</li> <li>3. Share your new purpose statement with other participants,</li> <li>4. Listeners, ask questions to ensure clarity of: <ul> <li>The general and specific purpose</li> <li>Why it's important to the audience, and</li> <li>How will the speaker would know if the outcome was successful</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Product	Each participant will have a well-defined purpose statement
Post-activity debrief	A few participants will share their purpose with everyone
