Committee Role

Each year, districts worldwide are mandated to establish an alignment committee. This committee's primary function is to assess club assignments within the district's areas and divisions and formulate a proposal to modify assignments as necessary. The proposal crafted by the committee must subsequently undergo a vote by the District Council during the Annual General Meeting (AGM) prior to its submission to World Headquarters. This year the vote will be held on May 27, 2025 at the combined District Council Meeting for District 21 which includes all clubs in both Districts 21 and 96.

Requirements

The requirements of the committee are outlined within Policy and Protocol 7.0 District Structure, 1. Club Assignments in the [Governing Documents](#). At a high level the requirements include:

- D. The best interests of the clubs and District are taken into consideration when assigning clubs to Areas.
 - I. Areas consist of four (4) to six (6) clubs; however, an Area may consist of three (3) clubs on July 1 only when an effort to charter a fourth club is in process.
 - II. Under no circumstances may an Area have more than six (6) clubs on July 1.
 - III. Advanced clubs shall not be segregated into Areas.
 - IV. Areas may be segregated by language, subject to the approval of the District Council.
 - V. Districts assign clubs to Areas based upon:
 - a. Geographic proximity to other clubs
 - b. The ability of an Area Director to effectively provide service, without requiring the clubs to change how meetings are conducted to accommodate an Area Director visit
 - c. Club size and strength (e.g., paid, active, disbanding)
 - d. Prospective clubs and expected growth
 - e. The likelihood of eligibility for Distinguished programs (e.g., club base of the Area or Division)
- E. A Division must have a minimum of three (3) Areas.

Situation

As a result of the attrition of clubs created by the pandemic, District 21 has lost a significant portion of its club base. At the start of the 2019-2020 program year District 21 had a base of 135 clubs and District 96 had 130. At the start of the 2024-2025 program years, those numbers dropped to 97 and 99 clubs respectively.

District realignment is a process initiated by the Toastmasters International Board of Directors in which representatives from certain Districts (in Regions 1–7) will meet as a Committee to modify the boundaries of the Districts with the goal of each District's boundaries so that each District has a minimum of between 120–180 clubs each. As a result, Districts 21 and 96 will officially merge—a decision driven not by convenience, but by circumstance and necessity.

Combining forces allows the new district to benefit from a deeper pool of experienced leaders, a wider array of resources, and a stronger support network for clubs and members. The merge creates space for collaboration, revitalization, and innovation while staying aligned with Toastmasters' mission of empowering individuals to become more effective communicators and leaders.

While change can be difficult, this merger represents a step forward—a chance to create a united, resilient district that not only adapts to current realities but builds a stronger foundation for the future of Toastmasters in our region.

Geographic Areas

Vancouver Island

The ongoing decline in the number of Toastmasters clubs on Vancouver Island and the Gulf Islands has made it increasingly challenging to maintain the current division structures. Rebalancing the areas on the island will improve leadership effectiveness, support future growth, and create a more sustainable and geographically appropriate framework for the region.

Sea to Sky, Sunshine Coast, North Shore and Vancouver

This geographic community has demonstrated strong potential for growth, with increases in both membership and the formation of new clubs. Many of these clubs are well positioned to achieve Distinguished status or higher, reflecting a solid foundation for continued development and future success.

Vancouver

This geographic community has demonstrated strong potential for growth, with increases in both membership and the formation of new clubs. Many of these clubs are well positioned to achieve Distinguished status or higher, reflecting a solid foundation for continued development and future success.

Vancouver, Coquitlam, Port Moody

This geographic community has demonstrated strong potential for growth, with increases in both membership and the formation of new clubs. Many of these clubs are well positioned to achieve Distinguished status or higher, reflecting a solid foundation for continued development and future success.

Burnaby

This geographic community has demonstrated strong potential for growth, with increases in both membership and the formation of new clubs. Many of these clubs are well positioned to achieve Distinguished status or higher, reflecting a solid foundation for continued development and future success.

Richmond, Delta, New Westminster

Over the past decade, this geographic community has experienced limited growth and has faced ongoing challenges in sustaining its existing clubs. In response, every effort has been made to rebalance the area by incorporating strong, stable clubs from the Vancouver region to enhance overall district stability and support.

Surrey and the Fraser Valley

In recent years, this geographic area has demonstrated success in growing membership within its clubs. Integrating clubs from District 96 will help create a more balanced structure, strengthening all areas within the division and promoting continued growth and collaboration.

Northern, Interior, Kootenays, Okanagan

This geographic area spans a wide range of rural communities across British Columbia, presenting unique challenges due to the distances between clubs, areas, and divisions. While these challenges are unavoidable, every effort has been made to provide consistent support to all areas, particularly within smaller communities. Despite being the most logistically complex division, it holds significant potential for the development of new clubs and continued growth.
